Title	Serving	Description
Fellowship of Christin Athletes (FCA)	3rd – 5th Grade students; will accept a younger sibling K-2 if an older sibling enrolled	Provides (20–25) 3rd-5th grade students with the opportunity to engage and have fun while they learn about teamwork, integrity, service, and excellence from a faith based perspective.
Florida Dance Theatre	3rd – 5th Grade students; Maximum of 20-25 students	Dance classes for 3rd – 5th grade students. Students will learn a variety of different dance styles, preparing for a performance at the end of the conclusion of the school year.
Flying Eagles Library Club	4th thru 5th grade students	Program for upper grade students interested in learning and supporting the school library program.
Garden Club/Teaching Kitchen	K-5th Grade students - 40 students divided into two rotating groups of 20 assigned to either garden or teaching kitchen.	Provides K-5th grade students with the opportunity to learn and develop skills related to gardening, fruits and vegetables, and nutrition.

Title	Serving	Description
Big Brothers/Big Sisters (BB/BS) -Mentoring	Kindergarten – Fourth Grade students	One on one mentoring program for students in Kindergarten through Fourth grade. Selected students (“littles”) are matched to screened and approved volunteers (“bigs”) who will meet with them one time weekly for one hour.
Eagles Nest II: Haven Resource Center	Student’s parents/guardians	Resource center on campus to support parents/guardians of students.
Emergency Food Pantry	Pre-K-5th Grade students	Provides nutritious non-perishable food to identified student’s families in need.
