Title	Serving	Description
Reading Pals	12 students	Reading program with 1st and 2nd graders to enhance reading levels and comprehension.
Young Ladies Club	9 students	The Young Ladies Club meets every Wednesday and is facilitated by one of our Florida Gulf Coast University Interns. The students discuss age-appropriate topics, such as building healthy friendships, leadership, establishing boundaries, positive imagery, and etiquette training.
Hand 2 Hand	10 students	Mentoring program collaborating with Dunbar High School football players and the local Farmers Market. The football team of Dunbar High School provides literacy engagement and tutoring to ten male students of Franklin Park Elementary.
