Afterschool Clubs (Variety)	3rd to 8th Grade Students	Extracurricular opportunities for 3rd to 8th grade students. Led by Staff to apply hands on learning in a recreational environment. Club options: Art, Dance, Debate, Drama, Fitness, Garden, Lego Builders, Science, Sports, Youth Crime Watch.
Expanded Learning Opportunity (ELO)	Grades K-2 with online supplement support, Grades 3-8 with FAST prep, Grades 7 and 8 with course recovery	Tutoring by certified teachers for grades K-8; Snack served
ReadingPals	1st grade students	Literacy Mentoring for striving readers in 1st grade. Community volunteers are paired with a child to read and practice social emotional learning for one hour each week. Students build a home library by taking home the books they read with their ReadingPal.
MECCA	Students K - 8th Grade	Mainstreaming Education College & Career Advancement - Tutoring
Police Athletic League of Hallandale Beach	K-12 students	PAL runs throughout the year, offering two to three sports children can choose from each month, such as baseball, basketball, boxing, cheerleading, football, soccer, and track and field. The teams travel throughout South Florida for games and are always accompanied by Hallandale Beach Police officers.
Lighthouse 4 Students	4th - 8th grade students	After-school and in-school programs primarily designed for students who need additional academic support. The L4S school and tutoring program is an extended educational program aiding with student's math, reading, and provides homework assistance.
