Mentoring Program	Grades 7-9 grade students with risk indicators for dropping out of school	Community members provide mentoring using the Growth Mindset model
Boys & Girls Club	7-12 grade students	After school program- tutoring, STEAM project based learning, snacks
Homework Café	7-12 Grade	Provides 7-12 grade students with an University of FL Pre-Teacher tutor for academic remediation and mentoring
Let's FACE IT	5th through 12th grade	This program is designed to provide skills-based prevention education for adolescents who are exhibiting poor decision making skills and who also may have alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use behaviors in their lives. It offers all youth a means of facing and resolving problems as it relates to alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. Let's FACE IT is also offered as an alternative to school suspension, expulsion, reassignment, or on the recommendation of a concerned party. In emphasizing relationship-building and communication, a parent or caregiver attends each session along with their daughter or son.
